# Keep the Nasties away from your Windows computer

The one challenge to Microsoft Windows based computers is 'malware' (Malicious Software). MS Windows does attract its lion's share of malware, mainly because it's global popularity and usage.

Keeping on top of the bad internet nasties need not be a headache. For most users, a good, free Anti-Virus application will do the job of controlling most nasties; but no single Anti-Virus application is 100% infallible. With that in mind, a little training can make all the difference when spotting rogue websites.

Look for a 'padlock' in the address bar and the code prefix "https://" at the beginning of the URL (web address), while visiting banking sites, entering your credit card data or accessing your web mail. Be careful when shopping at a website that ships items from overseas, and don't click on links sent to you in email messages, go directly to the website itself.


Avoid deals that are too good to be true, and don't click on email attachments from senders you don't know; and certainly don't open attachments that are from senders you do know, but are unexpected.

If you're running Windows 8 or higher, great! You have Windows Defender security built into the Operating System and don't need an Anti-Virus application. For Windows Vista, Windows 7, you can download and install Microsoft's Security Essentials which will protect you for free.

## Trisha turning tragedy to triumph at TAFE

Trisha Williamson, a young mother of two, who lost her husband to a terminal illness, is determined to build a better future for her children through her study at North Coast TAFE.



After the loss of her husband, Trisha found herself in the situation of being the major bread winner for her family.

"I dropped out of school at an early age and worked casual jobs before having my kids, so I had very little to offer employers in the way of qualifications," says Trisha.

Trisha was determined to get the education she needed to ensure a better future for her children, so she enrolled in the Certificate II Skills for Work and Training course at Murwillumbah TAFE.

"I never imagined that this course would open my eyes to so many possibilities. Originally I just wanted to gain a qualification that would help me reenter the workforce. Now, I am in the final six months of a Certificate IV Tertiary Preparation Course, which has given me a pathway to University," says Trisha.

"Many people believe that if you drop out of school you won't have the opportunity to study at University. I will be the first in my family to go to university so I am thankful that TAFE have provided me with a way to achieve this," says Trisha.

"Now not only will I have better job prospects, I am also being a positive role model for my children."

# **Connecting With Your Child**

To connect with our children, we must understand their emotions and experience those emotions with them. Let's see how one mother, Sheri, spent her morning connecting with her 5-yearold son, Nicholas.

7 a.m. — Nicholas wakes up screaming. Sheri runs to Nicholas and holds him tight. "You sound scared. What's wrong?" she asks. But Nicholas doesn't respond; he just cries. Sheri continues to hold him until he calms down, saying, "Whatever it is, you're really sad. I'm here for you." Soon, Nicholas stops crying and asks for breakfast.

What Sheri did right: Sheri acknowledged Nicholas's feelings. Instead of telling Nicholas to stop crying, Sheri labelled Nicholas's feeling and allowed him the chance to express that feeling. Nicholas sensed that it was okay to be sad and scared. Nicholas will likely feel free to express these feelings in the future.

9 a.m. — Nicholas is watching his favourite cartoon and has turned up the volume to an excruciating pitch. He laughs and dances while the characters sing. Sheri joins in and dances alongside him. She hugs him and then goes back to sweeping the kitchen.

What Sheri did right: Sheri could have scolded Nicholas for turning up the television or she could have just ignored him. Instead, Sheri recognized Nicholas's happiness and she joined him in it. This short interaction strengthens their bond. Nicholas feels loved and understood.

**11 a.m.** — Nicholas is playing with a friend, Jacob. Jacob pushes Nicholas off his bike, and Nicholas pushes him back. Sheri steps in and tells Nicholas, "It's not okay to hit Jacob. That hurts." "But he pushed me first," says Nicholas.



Sheri tells Jacob the same and takes Nicholas aside. She tells him, "Nicholas, I know you're mad. It upsets you when Jacob pushes you. You need to tell him not to push because pushing hurts."

What Sheri did right: Sheri focused on Nicholas's negative behaviour while validating his feelings. She connected with Nicholas by letting him know that it was okay to experience anger but not to hurt others.
